### Planning & Development

Tom said he did not have a formal report but said his goal was to develop a consistent process to track commercial and residential projects--know what looking for in a project and have this more clear and better documented. This will help articulate what the neighborhood is looking in terms of development guidelines, what its values are. Wants to develop clear expectations.
